About the University

Dhanamanjuri University located in the heart of Imphal city is bounded by National Highway No. 2, Thangmeiband Road, and the Naga River. The establishment of this university realizes a long-cherished dream, aiming to uphold Manipur's ancient tradition of intellectual pursuit and education.

The University, named after Maharani Dhanamanjuri, was once a college which began in 1946 as an evening college with no infrastructure of its own, now operates as a cluster of five constituent colleges: DM College of Arts, DM College of Commerce, DM College of Science, G.P. Women's College, and LMS Law College; fulfilling the primary goal of the National Scheme of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA): to convert existing colleges into a cluster university. The university was established under "The Dhanamanjuri University Act, 2017", which came into force on April 6, 2018.

About the Seminar

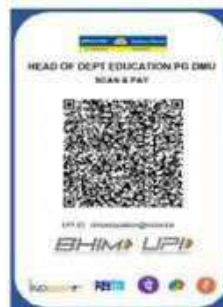
