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## ABOUT DHANAMANJURI UNIVERSITY

Dhanamanjuri University (D.M. University) was established on 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2018 under “The Dhanamanjuri University Act, 2017” through a notification in the Manipur Gazette published by the Department of Higher and Technical Education, Government of Manipur.



Dhanamanjuri University is a long-cherished dream of our founding fathers and Maharani Dhanamanjuri. Manipur, an ancient kingdom, had a composite traditional system of education in the field of warfare, martial arts, games & sports, culture, and many other schools of thought trained the people in various professional activities in ancient forms. The people have carried down this legacy of quest for knowledge and civilized existence since time immemorial. Ancient works of knowledge in the original scripts of Manipur stand as testimony to nurturing of the idea of a University in the minds of our forefathers and foremothers. The state has celebrated the tradition of a purely intellectual pursuit, which conserves the original ethos of the land and its people while being receptive to progressive changes in the course of time.

The University, under the National Scheme of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), is built up of five constituent colleges, namely, Dhanamanjuri College of Science (D.M. ## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. For the academic year 2025-26, admission to all PG programmes of Dhanamanjuri University will be done on the basis of the entrance examination only.
2. If a candidate has applied to Dhanamanjuri University but doesn't fulfil the eligibility criteria as per the requirement of the particular Program, his/her candidature will not be considered and incomplete applications shall summarily be rejected.
3. Applications for admission are to be submitted only through online at <https://www.dmu.ac.in> with an application fee of Rs. 500/- for General/OBC and Rs. 300/- for SC/ST/PWD.
4. Application Forms and E-Prospectus will be made available in university website <https://www.dmu.ac.in>.
5. Candidates shall submit the application forms through online mode
6. The printed copy of the successfully submitted application form along with the related documents and proof of fee payment shall be submitted to the concerned department.

## PROGRAMMES OFFERED

The University will admit students to the postgraduate programmes leading to Master degree from amongst the candidates who passed BA/BSc/Bcom (Three Year Degree Course) or equivalent examinations from a recognised University/Institute.

## MODE OF SELECTION

- a. Selection will be made purely based on total marks obtained in the Written Entrance Examination and weightages\* subject to the verification of original documents.

### \*Weightages:

- **Three marks shall be given to those students who have opted Honours or Major Subject in B.A./B.Sc./B.P.E.S./B.Com./LL.B.**
- **Two marks shall be given to those students who have participated in NSS Special Camp/passed NCC (C certificate) Course/participated in any Swachh Bharat Programme organised by the Institute/College concerned.**

- b. Scheme of written Entrance Examination (M.A./M.Sc./M.Com.)

- Multiple Choice Type Questions carrying 2 marks each.
- Full Marks – 100
- Number of Questions: 50
- Syllabus of the Written Entrance Examination shall be of Degree level of the subject concerned.
- Duration of Written Entrance Examination will be of 2 hours only.
- Candidates should bring the Admit Card on the day of Entrance Examination.
- No candidates will be allowed to sit in the Written Entrance Examination without the Admit Card.

- c. The Admission Committee shall decide the minimum marks of provisional eligibility for admission to PG Course as per the overall result of the Entrance Examination of that particular subject.

- d. Candidates securing below the minimum eligible marks in the entrance Examination shall not be allowed admission even in the eventuality of vacancies, however, the Admission Committee reserves the right for the final decision.

- e. The Admission Committee reserves the right for rechecking/re-evaluation of the Answer Scripts as and when required.
